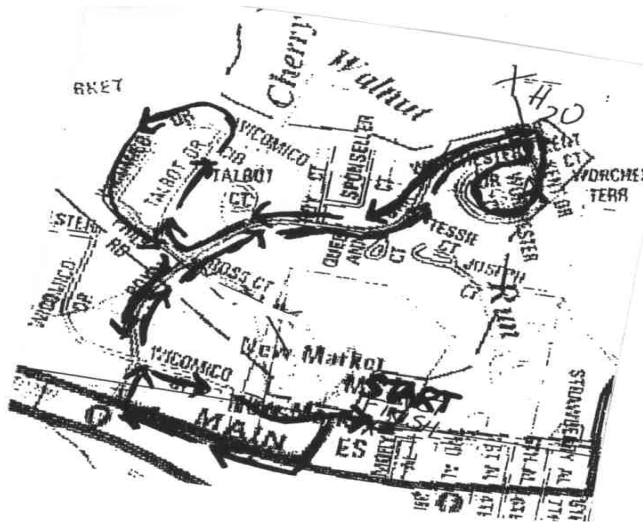
# New Market Fun Run

## Town Council

---

The Town Council meeting was held on March 8, 2006.

Shane Rossman was unanimously voted to replace retiring Councilwoman Kathleen Snowden. Councilman Rossman immediately stepped up to take the lead on town insurance and safety.

Councilman Romanell presented a report on Main Street sidewalk conditions and suggested solutions. He will take the lead in repairing sidewalk issues over the next few months.

The Town Council voted to participate in the Mosquito Control Plan for 2006. Frederick County will spray for larviciding and adult mosquitoes.

The council voted unanimously to amend the Comprehensive Development Plan to incorporate the Civil War Heritage Area Management Plan by reference.

Storm Drain Easement for Brinkley Manor was discussed. An agreement will be prepared for signing.

NMES requested use of town streets for a Fun Run on April 8th. Request approved pending insurance verification. See route map in this newsletter.

Town Clerk/Treasurer reported on the budget and gave an update on the plans for New Market Days 2006.

The regular Planning and Zoning meeting was held on March 7, 2006.

NMES. Approval was granted allowing the reduction of the net track from 12.3 to 1.8 for purposes of forest conservation.

82 West Main. Denied request to allow for artisan shop based on current ordinances. Approved request for shed and sign.

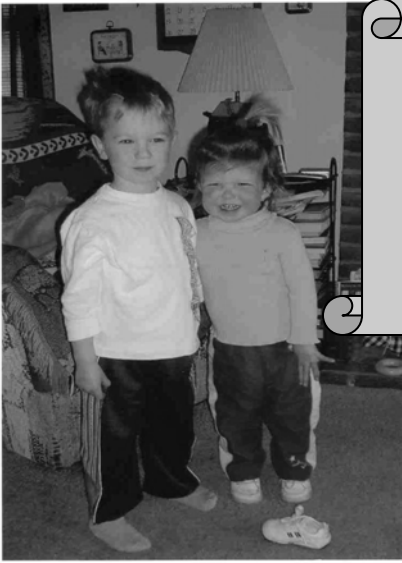
149 W. Main. Approved request for an addition to property.

### April 12th

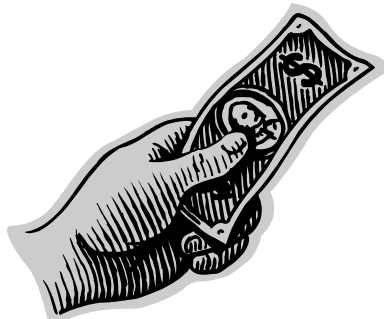
The New Market Grange will honor a local person with a Community Citizen Award. The evening will begin with a fellowship meal.

Answer: The Town of New Market was incorporated March 28, 1878. Isaac Russell was elected as the first mayor the same year.
